Medical Chief Petty Officer Cecil Cameron, W18052, Royal New Zealand Navy, distinguished himself by meritorious service in connection with military operations against a hostile force, while serving as Ward Master and X-ray Technician for the Forces Armee' Nationale Rumere (FANK) Training Command, Army Advisory Group, Dong Ba Thin Training Battalion, during the period March 1972 to November 1972. During his tenure at Dong Ba Thin Training Center. Chief Petty Officer actively set about training indigenous employees in the use of available equipment. He went on to collect materials needed for special X-ray contrast studies, thereby greatly increasing the diagnostic capability of the Dong Ba Thin X-ray facility. He personally examined and prescribed treatment for all admissions, regardless of the day or time of admission, and tirelessly made rounds late in the evening. His tireless efforts have resulted in the creation of a first class hospital. His contributions and achievements have tremendously aided the successful accomplishment of the mission of the Training Command. Chief Petty Officer Cameron's performance of duty was in keeping with the highest traditions of the New Zealand Navy and reflects great credit upon himself and the military service.
